- MRBID working with a local artist on an exciting concept design for an art installation on the superhub site, drawing inspiration from the former Rediffusion logo.
- Manor Royal 'Where Arts, Culture and Business collide' event on 17<sup>th</sup> October at Gatwick Production Studios, celebrating creativity in Manor Royal – register to attend at Manor Royal events.

CM thanked SS for his update, acknowledging there will be competition between businesses to attract people from the local talent pool. More work is required to tap into the excellent opportunities that exist at Gatwick, in Manor Royal and the town centre.

- Wendy Bell (WB) presented an update from the <u>Town Centre BID</u>

## including:

- Latest footfall figures report over 9m visitors to Crawley town centre in August'23
- Major contributor to this success is the town centre events programme e.g. Make Music Day attracted +16,000 people on one day in June 2023 (5,000 in 2022)
- 63% visitors live more than 25 miles from Crawley; average dwell time 61 minutes.
- BID has recently introduced the Third Wednesday Club networking aimed at professional services, supporting people as they return to the office.
- New CCTV cameras installed in Memorial Gardens
- <u>Creepy Crawley month</u> in October diverse programme of events including ghost tours, zombie roaming act, giant spider installation and 'hauntilogical' workshops.
- Christmas Lights switch on 17<sup>th</sup> November; festive village in Queens Square
- Children's Business Fair in Queensway 9<sup>th</sup> December
- TC BID recently awarded the 'Best Bar None' accreditation for safety.

CM thanked WB for the update, asking how we get the message about everything that is happening out to *new* people. WB reported that events are advertised on the digital sign outside Three Bridges railway station, via social and local media and through the streetwise (RH) magazines. Vikki Illingworth suggested using colleges and schools to get the word out; WB to follow this up.

- Vikki Illingworth (VI) presented an update from the college

- New term has started at pace with over 3,200 students enrolled so far; particular strength in growth of construction and engineering courses.
- Changes to GSCE grade boundaries this year meant many students entering college without maths and english.
- Institute of Technology proud of support from the Town Deal board and local businesses. No building on site yet however hoping to recruit construction contractors before the end of 2023.
- Chichester College Group has published a new <u>Strategic Plan 2023-2026</u>
- Significant challenges around recruitment, particularly in the areas of student support and pastoral care.

- Increasing number of young people and those aged 50+ on Universal Credit (UC) and searching for work; overall picture in Crawley remains fairly stable
- Priorities for Job Centre include 50+, In Work Progression (IWP), Health & Disability and Crawley refugees.
- Refugee employability programme delivering employment support, English language and integration support a local priority for Crawley.
