2.a. Digital programmer

If you have had a new boiler in the last few years, you will probably have a digital programmer to set the times your central heating turns on. This is usually found in your airing cupboard.

2.b. Timeclock programmer

Timeclock programmers have a clock with either sets of pins or arrows to set the programme. It will look something like this.
