The council submitted the Local Plan to the Secretary of State in November 2014 and Mr Martin Pike BA MA MRTPI was appointed to carry out an examination into the soundness of the Local Plan. 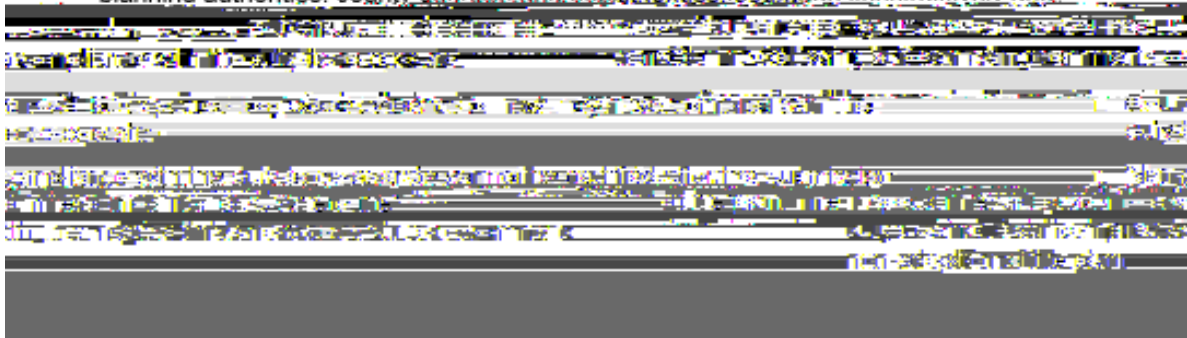
Appendix A: Explanation of Legal Compliance and Soundness

1. Legal compliance and duty to co-operate

- 1.1. The Inspector will first check that the plan meets the legal requirements and the duty to co-operate before moving on to test for soundness.
